Winnie the Pooh is a bear with very little brain and lots of "rumblies in his tumbly." Pooh's love for Christopher Robin (and honey!) are what set this story in motion. Pooh's good heart and friendship with all of the creatures of the Hundred Acre Wood make him a character who is so easy to love.

Supporting Characters



Piglet is a sweet, shy, and quiet little pig. While Piglet is known to be nervous and very easily scared, he also proves himself to be very intelligent and an excellent problem solver. Despite his fears, Piglet never leaves Pooh's side during their hunt for the Backson!



Tigger is not your everyday tiger. He is lovable, full of energy, and is always up for an adventure. When Tigger learns about the Backson, he is eager to bounce into the path of danger to help his friends. Tigger knows that he isn't ordinary, but he believes that his differences make him extraordinary! As Tigger says, "the most wonderful thing about Tiggers is "I'm the only one!"



Eeyore is a gloomy, but loyal, donkey. Despite Eeyore's gloomy demeanor, he is always there to help his friends (even if it means losing his tail in the process!)

Supporting Characters



Rabbit always wants what is best for his friends, but often isn't sure of how to help them due to his nervousness! Rabbit is the first character to discover the dangers of the Backson!



Owl is the well-educated and trustworthy overseer of all of the creatures of the Hundred Acre Wood. All of the animals look up to Owl and immediately come to him when they discover that Christopher Robin is missing!



Kanga is gentle, mature, and reasonable. Even though Roo is her only child, she is very nurturing to all of the creatures in the Hundred Acre Wood.



Roo is a playful little kangaroo and is the child of Kanga. Roo is bouncy, curious, and playful, and their greatest role model is Tigger.

Supporting Characters



Christopher Robin is a kind boy and a friend to all of the animals in the Hundred Acre Wood. All the animals in the Hundred Acre Wood (especially Winnie the Pooh) love Christopher Robin, which is why they all come to his rescue when he goes missing!

MUSIC AND SINGING

Winnie the Pooh Kids includes several musical numbers.

There will be live singing with microphones overtop of instrumental tracks, which might get loud at certain points. If you think this might be too loud, feel free to use your headphones, Loops, or let a staff member know when you arrive, and they can offer you earplugs if needed.

CHARACTER MOVEMENTS AND COSTUMING

In the show, the actors playing Pooh, Tigger, Eeyore, Piglet, Rabbit, Owl, Kanga, and Roo won't be dressed like animals. Their costumes have been modernized and are inspired by the characters. For example, the actor playing Pooh will not be wearing a fur bear suit, instead they will be wearing a red cropped t-shirt, a yellow romper, and bear ears.

THE BACKSON

"The Backson Song" has a spooky feeling to it, as the gang is learning about all of the horrible things a Backson can do! No need to worry, there is no such thing as a Backson (Pooh and his friends will learn this later in the show!)

HALFWAY DOWN

The song "Halfway Down" is a lullaby style ballad that occurs when our Hundred Acre Wood friends are stuck in the Backson pit. While it may make you sad that our friends are stuck, the song ends happily with all of our friends making it safely out of the pit.

Group Singing

During most of the musical numbers, the characters will sing together as a group. You might recognize some familiar songs such as "Winnie the Pooh" and "The Wonderful Thing About Tiggers." If you recognize a song and wish to hum along, you are more than welcome!

The lighting on stage will change throughout the show, but it will all be done gradually to match the mood of the scenes and songs. There will be no strobing or flashing lights.
